In addition we have relocated the August annual meeting to Camp Laughing Loon, begun compiling a Little Ossipee Lake Cookbook, and started building an "Erosion Control Program" that will help us maintain the water quality around the lake for this and future generations to come. These are some of the challenges that we have decided to focus on during the 2009 season, hoping that several of them, like the Erosion Control Program, will be carried into 2010.

The newly modified Mission Statement fits well into what we are looking to do in 2009 and beyond. This mission statement keeps the organization focused and has a rather catchy punch line: "E3, Preserve and Protect Little Ossipee Lake through Education, Eradication, and Erosion Control." Over time, many of you will be seeing the "E cubed" mission statement on our website, on future mailings, our hope is that you embrace this mission and in doing so, each individual will be doing his/her part to help preserve the lake. I encourage you to incorporate this theme during this year's boat parade.

Our new mascot "**LOLA the Loon**" can be heard when you open the website:

www.littleossipeelake.org. This has been therapeutic for those us who live for summer. The loons seen around Little Ossipee are evidence that the lake is healthy and alive. Their presence is a constant reminder of the work we must continue to do to keep the lake pristine.

This season, **LOLA** Officers and Directors wish to reach out to members on a more personal level. . We selected a new venue for the August annual meeting. Instead of the Waterboro Fire station, the meeting will be held at Camp Laughing Loon. Following the business meeting, we invite all members and their families to stay and join us for the first **LOLA** Cookout. This is our special thank you for continued membership and support for **LOLA**'s efforts to protect the lake. . Please come and enjoy the day with us!

Through the (much appreciated) volunteer effort of Ellen Orcutt, we are very excited to announce the making of the "Little Ossipee Lake Cookbook". This cookbook will be unique in that it will reflect recipes around the lake starting with appetizers, "Boat Launch Beginnings", covering the entire lake, ending with desserts at "Over the Dam Desserts". All are welcome to send in your favorite recipe with a catchy name for your favorite part of the lake.

LOLA continues significant efforts this year with "The Erosion Control Program" which is vital to the health of the lake now and in the future. This program is designed to combat shoreline erosion issues that negatively impact water quality and habitats in and around Little Ossipee Lake. To insure success, we are incorporating the expertise of the York County Soil and Water Conservation District. Our goal for 2010 is to develop a youth organization of college and high school students to repair damaged shore/ land property around the lake. We are planning to work on our first "test case" shoreline effort this July to understand the effort involved for 2010. Anyone interested in volunteering for this effort please contact me ... this will be great opportunity to understand what a proper shoreline needs to have to keep the lake alive and well.

Our decision to be involved in a bigger role around the lake unfortunately has an additional cost attributed to everything we do. The **LOLA** Officers and Directors voted to increase our yearly dues from \$10.00 to \$15.00. The \$5.00 increase alone will not fund all of our efforts, so please support us in any way you can, volunteering, attending our meetings,

our annual dance, being part of our 4<sup>th</sup> of July Boat Parade ...you will see us around, if not check our website for what we are doing during the month.

#### 2008-2009 Dam Report by Don Holden

This past year (2008,) the start of winter draw down began on October 15. Because of heavy rains in November the winter level of 4'6" was not reached until January 23, 2009. The lake this past year became completely frozen on January 9, 2009. For the most part, the activity at the dam was pretty normal through the winter and into this spring. I know many of you are interested as to when the ice goes out. There has been data being collected for many years, first by Doug Graves and then by myself. This "Ice-In" and "Ice-Out" data is collected and sent to a professor at the University of Buffalo, who collects the same data from many lakes all over the United States. We now have 19 years of record keeping.

Youth Conservation Corps: The future for our watershed by Melissa Brandt, YCSWCD [York County Soil & Water Conservation District All around the country this summer, high school students will take on the challenge of working in a YCC program. Programs are sponsored by land trusts, lake associations, and other conservation groups & involve HS age students in projects that improve their communities. They spend up to 8 weeks building walkways & steps, planting buffers, mulching soils & learning how we all impact our watersheds. This unique program empowers youth to take responsibility for their natural resources. YCSWCD approached LOLA to discuss the idea of creating a local YCC program to tackle erosion problems within the LOL watershed. A YCC program consists of a Director who is responsible for finding projects, hiring crew members, creating a plan & getting the project done. Staff also includes a crew leader & 5-8 crew members. LOLA would appoint a member to directly oversee the YCC, be the go

between for the board & staff, & for raising the funds to support this program. Many YCC programs are funded through the communities they work in & often a grant can help get a YCC up & running. Examples of funding sources are town government, lake associations, land trusts, conservation commissions, parks & rec, grants & more. Acton-Shapleigh has formed a YCC with great benefit to Moussam & Square Ponds.

#### Water Quality Report By Bob Labelle

Since 1977 our association has collected valuable water monitoring data in conjunction with the Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program (VLMP) and the Maine Department of Environmental Protection. Water samples are drawn from the deepest part of the lake every 2 weeks from April through October. During this period, 25 years of Secchi Disc Transparencies (SDT) and 11 years of basic chemical information have been collected.

Secchi Disc Transparencies are a direct measure of the water clarity and an indirect measure of algal growth. Unless a lake is highly colored or turbid from suspended sediment, transparency readings of 2 meters or less generally indicate a severe algal bloom according to the 2006 Maine Lakes Report. Little Ossipee Lake transparency readings are typically between 6.0 and 7.9 with occasional readings above 9.0 meters.

Basic chemical information includes water temperature and dissolved oxygen measurements at every meter down to 20 meters. Water samples are also submitted for Total Phosphorus and Chlorophylla monitoring.

Test results continue to show the water quality of Little Ossipee Lake to be excellent and the potential for nuisance algal blooms is considered to be very low. For additional information contact Maine DEP at (207) 287-3901 or the VLMP at (207) 783-7733, or on the Internet at

#### July 4th Boat Parade

The annual **Terry Hackett Memorial Boat Parade** begins at the dam at 11AM on July 4th. The **theme for 2009** is the **LOLA mission statement**, abbreviated as "**E**<sup>3</sup>", read "**E cubed**". All participating boats pick up their numbers in advance (from 10AM) at Salvos' dock - the Red Boat House near the Dam.

There are **2 classes**: 1 for boats (non-pontoon), and 1 for barges (pontoon). In each category, up to 3 prizes for each class will be awarded at the discretion of the judges, members of the LOLA Board, who watch the parade from Weymouth Point. For 2008, the prizes were awarded as follows:

1st-\$75.00, 2nd-\$50.00, 3rd-\$25.00 **Best-in-Show** is a trophy awarded to a boat in either class which exhibits the best environmental message/display. The winner holds the trophy until the next boat parade.
